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**DFW AIRPORT WELCOMES WORLD CUP FEVER
KOREAN AIR AIRCRAFT WILL FEATURE SOCCER STYLE IN THE
SKIES**

SEOUL, KOREA (February 8, 2002) -- Korean Air has introduced aircraft with World Cup graphics in celebration of the 2002 World Cup to be held in Korea and Japan later this year, and DFW International Airport will see several of the colorful planes this year.

Two different types of graphics are depicted on the aircraft that were unveiled in a ceremony yesterday at Korean Air's headquarters in Seoul. The World Cup emblem and two different graphics of a player doing an overhead kick have been added to one B747-400 and one B777 covering both sides of the aircraft. Graphics will be added to three more aircraft (one B747-400, one A330 and one B737) which will be added to operations by February 22. World Cup insignia were also placed on twenty Korean Air limousine buses operating in Seoul. The first World Cup aircraft (B747-400) took off yesterday at 2:20 p.m. heading for Jeju. The B777-200 will be added to operations today which departed at 11:25 a.m. heading for DFW International Airport.

Korean Air president Yi-Taek Shim, along with 250 other guests, attended the unveiling ceremony to kick-off the events leading up to the World Cup which will start in May. As the national flag carrier, Korean Air aims to take World Cup fever to its destinations around the world as part of the growing excitement for the games.

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"Korean Air is a real success story at DFW Airport and we congratulate them on this achievement," says Joe Lopano, executive vice president of marketing at DFW Airport. "The Seoul-DFW market is growing faster than the overall Seoul-U.S. market, showing the robust character of the DFW market and the demand for air service to and from Korea." Korean Air briefly suspended its DFW service after the events of September 11, but quickly resumed operations in December as business conditions improved. Korean Air now has three round trips weekly between Seoul and DFW.

Korean Air, with a fleet of 120 aircraft, is one of the world's top 20 airlines and operates almost 400 passenger flights per day to 82 cities in 30 countries.
